A miraculous meeting that changed my life
I met Nancy & Bob during one of the darkest and
most uncertain times of my life at a domestic
violence support group meeting. I found myself
broke, abused and terrified. I was living in a small
apartment with my stepdad and my young son.
I discovered the OHFF program – and was
interviewed and accepted. And my life was forever
changed. Nancy & Bob's financial and emotional
support brought hope and healing into my life. My
sons deserved a new beginning, too. And thanks to
this program, I was finally able to give it to them.



A dramatic turnaround

After five years of dedicated support – including in-depth discussions, mentoring, problem-solving and financial assistance – I underwent a remarkable transformation. With OHFF's help, I was able to move out of my father's apartment and into a beautiful home of my own. I reunited with my son and successfully removed the abuser from our lives. I was able to secure full custody of my two boys. I managed to rebuild my credit. And for the first time in a long while, I was able to sleep peacefully. I created a safe environment for my children, regained control over my finances and focused on advancing my career.

One of the most priceless parts of my journey was knowing I could open up to Nancy & Rob about anything – no matter how difficult, painful or overwhelming. That kind of trust and safety is rare and I will never take it for granted.

Life since graduation

I have happily raised two wonderful boys – one with a degree in Engineering/Computer Science and the other, a West Point Cadet pursuing a professional soccer career. I purchased a beautiful home in Westchester, where I built a loving family with my partner, who is a caring father. Additionally, I was part of a startup financial services company. Today, I'm proud to be part of a team that includes over 50 members, and we are continuing to grow.

My future looks bright

I want to make more time for travel and find a hobby that truly interests me. I also hope to become more involved with OHFF, moving beyond just annual participation to offer consistent support and make a meaningful difference in the lives of those in need, witnessing the hope and joy that come from helping.

A dedicated Psychology graduate.

I attended CUNY Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn, NY. I graduated in 2023 with a major in Psychology. Any educational support that I needed, the EMP program provided it.

Guidance and good advice was essential

Before I got into college, I was worried about my lack of guidance and financial support. I didn't know how I would pay for college. I researched finding the right college but I was stuck. I didn't know how to apply for aid. I didn't know what I was eligible for in foster care. It was all very stressful. The EMP program immediately connected me with a mentor for all of my questions. I got financial aid as a full-time student and learned how to work within a budget. During my college years, I needed tutoring and my mentor was able to instantly connect me with a one-on-one tutor, which was amazing.

My mentor was vital in my life - and still is

During my undergraduate journey, I had a lot of doubts. There were times I wanted to drop out and give up. Who can I talk to? My mentor was there for me. And I absolutely love her. She was insightful and provided critical thinking skills. "What do you want to do?" "What would your life look like?" It made me think about real-life decisions and kept me focused. She made me look at how far I'd come and how far I have left to go.

My first big-girl job

After graduation, I landed my first job very fast! It was not just because of my degree. It was also because Tanisha at OHFF connected me to internships – that really helped my resume look great. It seems like everything I apply for, I get!

I've been working as a Student & Temporary Housing Community Coordinator for the Department of Education. I work in shelters and temporary housing facilities. I support families and their children with any educational needs, including attendance checks, enrollments, clothing, immunizations...anything. I also launched my own personal skincare business since graduation. I think I have the drive and the dedication to back it.

Higher education is next on the agenda

In September 2025, I will be going back to school for my Master of Social Work at Fordham University. I needed some guidance and my mentor (who also went to Fordham) responded quickly – and even helped me with my personal statement for the graduate degree application. EMP mentors never leave you. I got in within two days of my submission!

A well-planned future

Ideally, I will be a licensed Social Worker with a Master's degree. And a dog mom, not sure about kids yet. And I want to be living in NYC or New Jersey. Hopefully, married, I'm manifesting it all!

I am so grateful for the EMP program and my mentor. I would not know her if it weren't for the EMP program. Six years later and I'm still connected with her! I look forward to coming back to OHFF to show everyone my Social Worker license when I get it.
